

PARSAGUS

(HERBAL EXTRACT)

PARSAGUS contains organic asparagus and organic parsley that exhibits "urine-driving effects". It helps the body to increase excess fluid and impurities elimination. It also supports therapy in cases of heart failure and hypertension. It is also beneficial against bladder diseases, kidney and urinary gravel or kidney and bladder stones. PARSAGUS does not have negative influence on electrolyte exchange, lipid and uric acid metabolism. In contrast to synthetic-chemical diuretics, PARSAGUS has no side effects, except allergies in a few rare cases. PARSAGUS should be preferred over synthetic-chemical diuretics in most cases. Synthetic-chemical diuretics work better in acute emergency cases when fluid has to be removed from the body quickly. However, for long-term therapy, PARSAGUS would be the suitable alternative.

PARSAGUS contains many active substances, vitamins, minerals, and trace elements such as asparagine, glycoside, calcium, phosphorus as well as a relatively high content of potassium, Vitamin A, B and C.

Medicinal Ingredients:

Each vegetarian capsule contains:

Asparagus officinalis (Organic asparagus root) 200 mg

Petroselinum crispum (Organic parsley leaves) 200 mg

Non-Medicinal Ingredients: Microcrystalline cellulose, magnesium stearate

RECOMMENDED DOSAGE

Adult Take four capsules three times daily or as directed by a practitioner.

Recommended use or purpose: As a diuretic.

Caution/Warnings

Do not exceed recommended dosage.

Contraindications

Do not use if pregnant or breastfeeding or if you have inflammatory kidney disease. Do not take irrigation therapy if edema exists because of functional heart or kidney disorder.

Flush out of the urinary tract; prevent
