

Contraindications

Do not use if pregnant or breastfeeding. This product is not intended for individuals who have diabetes, kidney disorder, irritated digestive conditions, heart condition, high blood pressure, gastrointestinal inflammation or infection, gallbladder or bile-duct obstruction, hiatal hernia or acid reflex condition.

INGREDIENTS	INDICATIONS
Bean	Support treatment for inability to urinate, or infection of the urinary tract ¹ .
Bearberry	Inflammatory disorders of the efferent urinary tract.
Birch	Mild diuretic to assist in treating urinary tract infection.
Horsetail	Post-traumatic and static edema, irrigation therapy for bacterial and inflammatory diseases of the lower urinary tract and renal gravel.
Java-tea	Irrigation therapy for bacterial and inflammatory diseases of the lower urinary tract and renal gravel.
Juniper	Diuretic and urinary tract antiseptic.
Licorice	Urinary and intestinal inflammation.
Long-leaf buchu	Inflammation and infection of the kidney and urinary tract, bladder irritation; disinfectant of the urinary tract and as a diuretic.
Peppermint	A digestive aid; for relief of flatulence and/or bloating due to excess gas production and for symptomatic treatment of digestive disorders.
Restharrow	Irrigation therapy for inflammatory diseases of the lower urinary tract; prevention and treatment of kidney gravel.
Rupturewort	Disorders of the efferent urinary tract and inflammatory disorders of the kidney and the bladder ² .
White willow	Diseases accompanied by fever, rheumatic ailments and headache; combination with diaphoretic drugs could be considered.

SPECIAL COMMENTS

Evidences from Germany show that, as a long-term therapy, BUCCO can be administered for three to six months without side effects. For acute and chronic infection of the urethra, pyelitis, cystitis, urine retention, or prostate participation, consider SOLIDAGO.
